

As we continue our Remote Education journey, we are always looking at ways to ensure our pupils receive a range of lesson types and maintain social interaction with their class

This week saw the launch of live lessons and assemblies for Years I to 6, where pupils can interact with their Class Teacher, supporting adults and peers in a live way.

Over the forthcoming weeks, these opportunities will continue to be available for your children to join in with. All our live sessions are also recorded so if you cannot make the scheduled time, you can go back and watch it when it is suitable for you.

There are two different types that your child may be invited to.

Live Events

We use this for our Achievement Assemblies and some Class Assemblies. A live event through Teams gives many people from the same organisation the permission to watch an event but does not allow them to have their microphone or camera on. There can be a Q&A panel at the side, if the presenter has this switched on for pupils to answer questions given but this should only be typed into if prompted by the host.

To access live events links will be posted into the Class Team and you can join by clicking the link just be fore the start time.

Meelings

We use these for our lessons and class get togethers. During these everyone in the class can see each other, if their camera is switched on. If you are at home joining in, it is your choice whether you have the camera on or off, but it is nice for the children to see each other and know that they are still part of that special class team. To join these there

will be a link in the Class Team which they can click on or they can click on the event in their Teams Calendar.

Following this message there is a Pupils Guide to Joining Live Lessons and an example of the visuals they may see their teachers using during the lessons.

We hope to see as many of you as possible joining the Live Lessons — they are proving to be very popular and a lot of fun (I hear there are some great class Team games and quizzes happening too!).
